Water System Summary

Eagle Lakes WTP is a Category II Class C Water Treatment Facility located at 3410 Old Kings Rd. in Flagler Beach and serves a population of approximately 265. The plant has a FDEP Permitted Maximum Day Operating Capacity of 30,000 gallons per day.

Water System Components Eagle Lakes

- One (1) Water Treatment Plant
- One (1) Ground Storage Tank
- One (1) Reverse Osmosis Unit
- Two (3) High Service Pumps
- Two (2) Potable water wells (2) Wells

Wastewater System Summary

Eagle Lakes WWTP (Permit Number FLA452274) is an existing 0.042 million gallons per day (MGD) annual average daily flow (AADF) permitted capacity extended aeration activated sludge domestic wastewater treatment facility (WWTF). The wastewater treatment effluent is discharged on-site via two rapid infiltration basins. The WWTF also receives concentrate reject flows in its influent stream from a reverse osmosis water treatment facility.

- One (1) Wastewater Treatment Plant
- One (1) Lift Station

Eagle Lakes, Flagler County has 106 water connections and 106 wastewater connections. The Florida Governmental Utility Authority (FGUA) Community Service Representative (CSR) for the area deals with all customer concerns received by telephone and email. The FGUA Customer Service is open from 8am – 5pm, Monday through Friday with a number for after-hours should an emergency arise.

Community Activity
