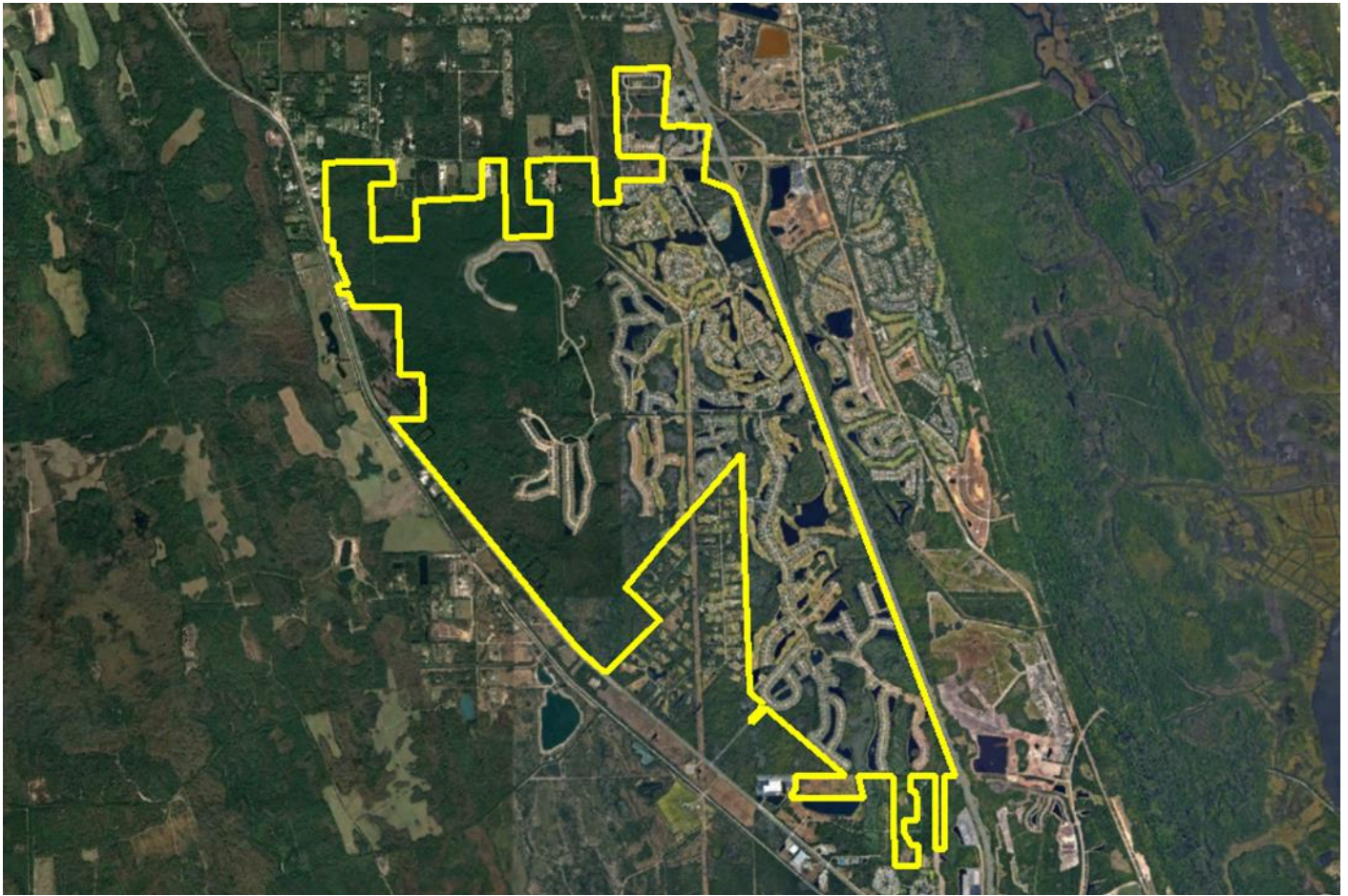


Plantation Bay Service Area



Water System Summary

The Plantation Bay WTP is a Category 1 Class C Lime Softening Water Treatment Facility located at 1600 S. Dixie Highway in Bunnell and serves a population of approximately 3,522 . The WTP has a FDEP Permitted Maximum Day Operating Capacity of 756,000 gallons per day.

Water System Components Plantation Bay

- One (1) Water Treatment Plant
- Four (4) Potable Water Wells
- Filtration
- One (1) Ground Storage Tank
- One (1) Generator
- Five (5) High Service Pumps

Wastewater System Summary

Plantation Bay WWTP is a 0.475 MGD AADF permitted capacity slow-rate public access system consisting of one 1.70 MGD percolation/holding pond and a 75-acre public access reuse system located at approximately Latitude: 29° 24' 06" N Longitude: 81° 10' 17" W (1600 S. Dixie Highway in Bunnell).

- One (1) Wastewater Treatment Plant
- Eighteen (18) Lift Stations

Plantation Bay, Flagler County has 2,178 water connections and 2,181 wastewater connections. The Florida Governmental Utility Authority (FGUA) Community Service Representative (CSR) for the area deals with all customer concerns received by telephone and email. The FGUA Customer Service is open from 8am – 5pm, Monday through Friday with a number for after-hours should an emergency arise.

Community Activity

The CSR is also working closely with the Flagler County Commission. Any disruption in service announcements or boil water notices will also be handled by the CSR, who is also charged with working with local media, updating them on any service-related matters.
